1. This Act, which amends the Immigration Act, may be cited as the Immigration (Amendment) Act 1998.

2. Section 6 of the Principal Act is hereby amended by the substitution in subsection (5) for the words “twenty-five thousand dollars” of the words “not less than twenty-five thousand dollars nor more than fifty thousand dollars” and for the words “twelve months” of the words “two years”.

3. Section 10 of the Principal Act is hereby amended by the substitution in subsection (6) for the words “twenty thousand dollars” of the words “not less than twenty thousand dollars nor more than forty thousand dollars” and for the words “six months” of the words “twelve months”.

Act.

4. Section 34 of the Principal Act is hereby amended by the substitution —

- (a) in subsection (1), for the words “thirty thousand dollars” of the words “not less than thirty thousand dollars nor more than sixty thousand dollars” and for the words “six months” of the words “twelve months”;
- (b) in subsection (3), for the words “six months” of the words “twelve months”;
- (c) in subsection (4), for the words “six months” of the words “twelve months”.
