ARRANGEMENT OF SECTIONS

SECTION

1. Short title.
2. Insertion of new section 114A in the Principal Act.

AN ACT to amend the Spirits Act.

A.D. 1984 Enacted by the Parliament of Guyana:—

Short title. 1. This Act, which amends the Spirits Act, may be cited
 Cap. 82:24 as the Spirits (Amendment) Act 1984.

Insertion of new section 114A in the Principal Act. 2. The Principal Act is hereby amended by the insertion after section 114 of the following section as section 114A —

“Power to accept compensation for offences. 114A. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Act, the Comptroller may, in any case he deems proper and in substitution for any proceedings in a court of summary jurisdiction, accept on behalf of the State a sum of money by way of compensation from any person reasonably suspected of a contravention of the Act or any regulations made thereunder:

Provided that such compensation shall be accepted only where the person reasonably suspected of such contravention has expressed his willingness in such form as the Comptroller may prescribe by order, that the contravention as aforesaid shall be so dealt with.”
